Day Time

Over 200 campers invade TASP every morning. Campers check-in with their day group counselor before heading to their activities. Many day campers come to think of their counselors as "big brothers & sisters", they are the first and last people they see each day. Lunch with friends in the dining hall, then our full day campers are off to their afternoon activities.

Bow & Stern

During our Bow & Stern sign ups, campers are provided with the opportunity to spend time with friends they have made at Tabor. Earlier in the day, everyone is informed of the activities that will be offered that afternoon (day campers) and night (residential campers) and then campers can sign up for the activity of their choice. Past activities include trips to the movies, playing miniature golf, socials and more!

Theme Thursdays

The Port and Starboard program is a biweekly evening activity and a weekly day activity, which divides the program into several competitions. Run by the "Admiral," this fun intramural program is a competition for total points. At the start of the program, children are issued a red (Port) or green (Starboard) T-shirt to wear. Some of the competitions are creative and the team that can create the best looking green or red outfit, make-up, or hat captures points. The rivalry builds as the summer progresses, culminating at the Program Awards Ceremony. Activities may included tug of war, cardboard box boat races, athletic competitions, obstacle courses, and capture the flag. Make your own

Tabor Boy

What you'll need:

Baby foil loaf pan; non-hardening modeling clay; Flexible vinyl report cover; permanent marker; scissors; bamboo skewer, Fishing line.

How to make it:

- 1. Gently pinch one short end of the loaf pan to shape the boat's bow and then re-straighten the sides of the pan.
- 2. Press a 1 1/4-inch-wide ball of clay onto the center of the boat floor.
- 3. On the report cover, draw a triangular sail (7 ½" high and 7" across the base).
- 4. Cut out the sail, fold it in half vertically, and make a tiny cut into the fold 1" from the top, and another 1" from the bottom.
- 5. Unfold the sail.
- 6. Cut a 9 ½" length from the bamboo skewer and thread it through the holes in the sail.
- 7. Insert the mast bottom straight down into the clay.
- 8. Make a small hole in the bow and tie on a long piece of fishing line for maneuvering and retrieving the boat once it's launched.
